#### **VOCATIONAL TRAINING TO MEANINGFUL JOBS**

#### Dear Friends,

I am proud to share this year's Annual Newsletter, full of stories



accomplishment and inspiration from our little corner of the world. Two years out from the pandemic, the Amigos team is resolved in our commitment to long-term investment that is leading to real and lasting impact in the community.

This year's accomplishments include: training in new areas such as solar installation and community tourism that will bring jobs to Santa Cruz, expansion of our Reading Program to include 144 local children, support for 64 women entrepreneurs to run their own business, and awarding 74 secondary and higher education scholarships. We also trained 78 teachers in sexual and reproductive health education, while continuing to engage parents and youth on this important topic.

However, while we celebrate our accomplishments, we also know that the challenges are great. The men and women of Santa Cruz are feeling the pull to migrate to the United States grow ever stronger. The majority in our village do not want to leave their community and their family. Our challenge, as Amigos, is to shape a stronger, healthier and more resilient Santa Cruz, where families can stay and thrive. We will do this through access to quality education, and through economic opportunities that are fair and dignified. Together, we can meet this challenge. Please join us and support our work today.

### BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS TO SEXUAL HEALTH EDUCATION

Despite cultural and religious barriers, women in Santa Cruz have begun to talk about reproductive health. Amigos staff are helping to soften these barriers by engaging women directly and privately in ways and in places where they feel most safe, including their own homes.

By taking the time and care to ensure safe spaces for discussion, women are able to listen more openly and to ask questions. They are getting the information they need about puberty, pregnancy, health and selfconfidence for themselves and for their school-aged children. as budding young chefs.

Raising employment and income levels are key to ensuring a better future for the young men and women of Santa Cruz. That is why ensuring a clear pathway from training to employment is one of the four priorities Amigos de Santa Cruz has committed to implementing as part of our 2023-2027 Strategic Plan.

### WELCOME TO OUR NEW READING CENTER!

Our Reading Program has come a long way! Ten years ago we started a Model Classroom Program in the local preschool, and five years ago we shifted our focus to start an Afternoon Reading Program that encourages a love for reading while developing creativity and critical thinking skills.

But we did not stop there! This year, with the help of many generous supporters around the world, we were able to purchase a dedicated

reading space which we intend to remodel to provide better conditions and access to quality education for the future leaders of our community.

Ten years on, we are seeing the fruits of our investment with students from our first early education cohort qualifying for scholarships in a selective private school!

### **20 YEARS OF EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

This year, as in previous years, Amigos has awarded an increasing number of scholarships for middle school, high school and university studies. We now also provide additional support including computer access and weekly tutoring sessions. These tools enable youth to access secondary and higher education for the very first time, a first step toward breaking the cycle of poverty in Santa Cruz.

### **ELENA'S STORY**

Building sustainable, community-based tourism

Elena is one of a kind, with an outgoing personality and winning smile. Yet she struggled to start a tourism business after the pandemic. In 2021, she participated in Amigos' Community Tour Guide Certification Course, learning the skills and business strategies to become a successful guide and help her business grow. Now Elena has joined ten other guides to form the first-ever Santa Cruz Guide Association, and one of only two women in the group. She is particularly known for her energetic hikes and her local cultural sauna tour. Come give it a try the next time you are in town!

#### WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS MAKE PROTECTING LAKE ATITLAN THEIR BUSINESS

This year, Amigos formed new alliance with Atitlán Recicla, a lakewide initiative of the NGO Amigos del Lago focused on reducing solid waste Atitlán Lake while in generating income for local women. The program supports 10 women from the villages of Santa Cruz and Tzununá, and will soon additional support an group in Jaibalito. The women receive training handling recyclable in

materials, using scales and sorting materials, and how to create a business plan. Working in cooperatives, they collect and clean recyclables for which they receive payment based on the material collected. So far in 2022, they have collected more than 39 tons of recyclables! This has contributed to their household income while reducing the amount of trash around the lake. A win-win for everyone!

Daniel's work now focuses on empowering youth through sexual health education, leadership and professional opportunities. He is especially proud of his work developing local men's groups to talk about emotions and mental health.

This year, Daniel was also elected President of the Community Council for Local Development (COCODE), an important community leadership position. He is a shining example of how a person with access to education and training can contribute to improving his own community!
